Firstly may I take this opportunity to introduce myself as the new Membership Secretary . I have also taken over the responsibility for producing the quarterly News review for the Miniature Horse Club of Great Britain since it's founder Pricilla Cox emigrated to the sunny State of Texas. I am sure you will join with me in wishing her well.

My name is Maxine Foulkes, I am Head of Lower School in a large Primary School in the Midlands and I have been involved with showing ridden and in hand ponies for over 30 years. More recently (5 years ago) my daughter and I have become involved with the 'addictive world' of The Miniature Horse. In fact it is probably Claudia, if you are involved with showing that you have probably seen around. Usually dressed in lilac (now changed to cerise pink) with a bowler hat to be seen telling her groom, MEI what I have or have not managed to do.

We have Four Miniatures at present, all little girls who are all shown. These will be added to in the Autumn by two of this years foals. We are presently trying to breed our first foal and have one of our girls at stud so I shall be glad of any advice that all you experienced breeders out there can give me.

I start this news review with an apology for it's late mailing. It was due to be sent out in May but it is like anything new it always takes a lot longer the first time and we were very keen to produce a professional publication. (I would welcome any comments good or bad please- everything needs to updated in order to improve). Since your last News Review (previously called The Mini Neigh) we have worked exceptionally hard to offer members a whole wealth of Miniature related activities and publications. The club committee had worked hard over the Winter Months to put together our first show. We employed the services of Senior AMHA judge Mr Wayne Hipsley which was a big decision to make not knowing the quantity of entries that we would receive .An email to me from Mr Duane McPherson, the Chief Executive of AMHA informing me that he wished to attend our show, really made up our minds to make the show as big a success as possible. We had 67 horses entered for the show, which was an excellent start to the showing calendar. Mr Hipsley gave a very informative commentary following each class on how he had placed each horse, this was well received by exhibitors and the very large audience, many of them were having their first introduction to showing Miniature Horses . We rounded the day off with the championships. Supreme of the Day was Mrs Gill Jones' Looking Glass Inspiration shown by Carol Cooper.

Following the show exhibitors had a more informal chance to meet with Mr Hipsley, Duane and his wife Vicky, who was former employee of AMHA,

when they joined us for a Bar B Que.

I hope all of you that attended enjoyed your day.

Following the show Mr Hipsley had the following to say

"I was very impressed with the participation in the first AMHA sponsored Miniature Horse show in England. The overall quality of the horses was very competitive with horses at the major horse shows in the United States. "

"The turnout of the exhibitors was excellent for a new show, with a "new" breed in England. Everyone who participated appeared to understand the

importance of a positive image, and showmanship."

" The feedback on the commentary after each class was a fantastic method to provide the exhibitors an opportunity to understand their strengths and weaknesses of their horses as well as their showmanship. It also stimulated questions to assist exhibitors on a private basis.

"The obstacle class presented a new challenge for some competitors, one that they proved to be very qualified to meet the challenge. The Miniatures continued to prove the ability to be handy, and trainable for the obstacle work."


plumtree jango is imhps licenced, he is chestnut.





Select a show horse.

You've been to show, caught sight of these amazing little horses and how you are hooked!!!

You need one of your own. But where to start?

Showing can be exciting, rewarding and confusing; so here is the beginners guide to finding your ideal show horse.

Remember miniatures come in all shapes and sizes and an array of colours be open minded when you look around, once you have viewed a number of horses you will have a specific goal in mind.

- Ask breed societies for their list of breeders, try to visit as many studs as you can.
 Prices vary dramatically, depending on bloodlines and the success rate of that stud in the show ring, so ask for a sales list so as not to waste your time and the studs time.
- Pet prices will start at a few hundred pounds, top show horses could be tens of thousands of pounds have a budget in mind.
- Take an experienced person along with you. A current horse owner or breeder will be a good choice, a second opinion is valuable when viewing horses.
- Don't fall in love with the first horse you see. It's easy when you're excited and motivated to buy the first horse you look at. Does this horse really meet your objectives.
- Take a measuring stick or ask to see the horse measured, most breeders will be willing to measure for you; does the horse come with a height guarantee? In other words if the horse goes over height will you be given any refund?
- Ask to see pedigrees; all horses by the end of 2003 will have a passport with their recorded pedigree.
- Ask to see the horse on the move. To days show horse should have near perfect conformation. This is where experience is needed. Watch the horse's movement, do the legs move straight. Does he have that 'look at me' attitude?
- Does this horse appeal to you? You have to look at him 24. 7 the judge will see him a handful of times a year.
- If you are buying a foal that is not yet weaned, be prepared to pay a deposit and ask for a receipt. Take a good look around are you happy leaving your new foal in his present surroundings? Are the paddocks secure, weed free, what about vaccinations and worming? It may be a good idea to insure your new purchase. Ask if you can visit regularly.
- Ask to see the parents of the horse, if they are available, do they each have a proven show record?
- Right decision made. It is always a good idea to have the horse vetted, tell the vet you are purchasing the horse as a future show prospect he will then give his opinion of conformation.
- All being well, bring your horse home and now the real addiction starts......

Projecting the Mature Height of your Miniature Horse

The end of the breeding season is fast approaching. You inspect your prize youngstock.

Will they be good enough to possibly win us a class?.

But one question that we all worryingly ask ourselves is how much will he or she grow?

Is there any danger that our future champion may go over height?

The chart below may help to settle your mind or send you into a state of paranoia depending on your little darling's measurement.

Before you measure your Miniature make sure that they 1. have had their feet trimmed recently 2. that they are standing square and still on hard level ground 3. that their head is approximately level with their withers..

Miniature Horse Club of Great Britain SHOW RULES.

(1) REGULATIONS.

- Horses must be entered in the correct class, observing the correct age.
 No Miniature will exceed 34" in height at maturity. Except in the specified overheight class where the height limit will be 38".
- 2. Handlers must be suitably turned out. Hats, gloves, boots and jackets are required. Training shoes are optional for performance classes.
- The judges decision is final.
- 4. Exhibitors are required to withdraw from a class if the judge has an interest in his or her exhibit. For the purposes of this rule, a judge has an interest in an exhibit if he/she has bred, owned, trained or has a financial interest in it.
- Any horse acting in an unruly manner will be excused from the ring by the judge or steward for safety reasons.
- 6. The names of exhibits will not be made known to the judge until after the class. Exhibitors will be issued with a number for each horse that must be displayed whilst that horse is in the ring.
- 7. Cruelty, abuse or inhumane treatment of any horse, will not be tolerated by show management and the offender will be barred for the duration of the show.
- 8. Conduct by an exhibitor, trainer or owner deemed unsportsman like, abusive or detrimental will not be tolerated the MHCGB, including but not limited or, threatening, abusive or intimidating conduct (physical, verbal or written) toward any show official or fellow exhibitor. Any person guilty of such conduct should be reported immediately to the show management. The management will suspend the offender for the duration of the show. Any person accused of unseemly behaviour may appeal his/her case to the council of the association which will render a decision. If found guilty such a person may be banned from further participation in Club events and a decision will be published in the official publication of the Club.
- 9. Exhibitors are requested not to converse with the judge unless initiated by the judge.
- 10. Late arrivals will not be admitted to the ring once the gate has closed or the class has commenced.
- 11. a. Objections must be made in writing with a £50 cash fee to the show committee no late than one hour after the alleged incident. The fee will be returned to the protester in the event the protest is sustained If the protest is not sustained the fee shall be forfeited.
 - Any protests shall be adjudicated by a protest committee of three show officials not involved with the incident/dispute.
 - c. The show protest committee shall meet promptly and adjudicate the issue, make effective its decision upon the parties in interest and report its determination to all parties. A show protest committee may disqualify a competitor and or his/her entries for the duration of the show.

(2) PRESENTATION FOR SHOWING.

The permissible methods for showing are:

- a. Freshly clipped
- b. Clipped with new coat established or
- In natural condition

So long as the horse is neat, healthy and well presented.

Manes and tails are natural. A bridle path may be clipped into the mane to enhance the outline of the horse. Tails are to be trimmed clear of the ground.

Alteration of the natural colour of the horse is not allowed, however, subtle use of makeup to enhance a natural colour is allowed.

General preparation and presentation is at the discretion of the owner, but the MHCGB wishes to promote the horse as being shown at its best visual and health advantage to portray the breed as one of beauty, intelligence and gentleness. NOTE: 'circus' or 'cute' type presentation is not relevant in any class other than the costume class.

(3) PRELIMINARY JUDGING HALTER CLASSES.

The horses are asked to enter the ring in a clockwise direction. They are observed at walk. The steward will ask the horses to halt in a corner of the ring and each horse will be individually observed in trot. The judge calls the horses into a preliminary line up choosing his preferred horse first and so on.

Each horse is then posed for the judge to observe all sides. The horse will be walked in a straight in line from the judge and trotted back and will then re take his position in the initial line up.

When all the horses have been observed, they are asked to walk together again clockwise round the ring.

The final line up is then called in and Rosettes are awarded.

The horses are judged on:-

1. TYPE the horse must possess horse like qualities in a smaller size and proportion. Pony-like traits are not desirable in the modern miniature horse.

2. CONFORMATION. Consider the correctness of structure and conformation. Identify any faults and weaknesses.

3. QUALITY which includes the harmony and balance of body parts, the refinement and density of bone in the legs and the smoothness of muscling.

 WAY OF GOING Perhaps meriting a higher consideration. Not just the quality of movement but the technical correctness of the stride, articulation of the joints, elevation and impulsion.

5. PRESENCE.

(4)CHAMPIONSHIPS.

The first and second places from the applicable classes are called to the championship.

Horses will be observed at walk and trot. The first and second from each class are lined adjoining one another. The horses are posed for the judge to reassess. Champion and Reserve champion are selected.

(5) SPECIALITY HALTER CLASS - COLOUR CLASSES.

These classes are judged on 80% colour, 20% conformation. A broken coloured horse should have a balance of 50/50 colour.

(6) DRIVING CLASS.

The horses enter the arena clockwise at a collected trot. They are observed on both reins in the arena at a WALK; a free, regular and forward moving 4 beat gait. The horse should walk energetically, but calmly with even and determined pace. COLLECTED TROT; The horse should maintain forward impulsion while showing submission to the bit. The trot is slower and more collected, but the horse should indicate willingness to be driven on the it wile maintaining a steady cadence. AND WORKING TROT: this is a clear but not excessive increase in pace and length of stride. The horse goes forward freely, engaging the hind legs with good hock action, on a taut but light rein, the position balanced and unconstrained. Should show good energy, impulsion and cadence. The horses are required to STAND quietly and to REIN BACK. This class is judged on:

- 1. Performance
- 2. manners.
- 3. way of going
- 4. conformation
- 5. appropriateness
- 6. Condition and fit of vehicle and harness
- 7. Neatness of attire.

A judge may dismiss from the ring any unsafe horse, vehicle or equipment.

(7)JUMPING CLASS.

Classes will either by judged with 4 faults for a knockdown and 3 faults for a refusal or timed with 4 seconds added for a knockdown.

The showmanship class is an assessment of the handler's ability to show and turn out his/her horse.

The above pattern is used.

Points can be awarded for the following:-

Appearance of handler 10 points, suitability and cleanliness. Gloves, hat, boots and jackets are required Appearance of horse 40 points, (conformation is not a factor.) Cleanliness, conditioning and tack. Showing of horse 50 points

The judge is looking for accuracy of performance and correctness of training.

(11) PROGENCY CLASSES

Produce of dam.

To be judged with emphasis on the reproductive likeness, uniformity, quality of breed characteristics and confirmation. The minimum of two offspring, and a maximum of four per entry. Any sex of offspring may be shown. One number is issued per group of horses.

Produce of sire.

This class will be judged with emphasis on the reproductive likeness, uniformity, quality of breed characteristics and confirmation. The minimum of two progeny, and a maximum of four per entry. Any sex may be shown. One number is issued per group of horses.



(8)OBSTACLE CLASS.

An obstacle course will be constructed and can be viewed by competitors. The fastest horse to complete the course shall be the winner. Time faults will be added for penalties.

(9) LIBERTY.

(Please note Training guide is available free of charge to fully paid up members)


Liberty is demonstrating the natural beauty of the horse. Horse are to be judged on style, grace, animation, gaits, presence, music and suitability, ease of catching.

Judging begins when the halter is removed. Time of liberty is 1 ½ minutes, time to catch, 1 ½ minutes. (If not caught until after the 1 ½ minutes the horse is disqualified)

One exhibitor (wearing the number) and one handler allowed in the ring. Horses to by caught by the exhibitor.

The following assessment can be made. Style and grace 30 points, animation and presence 30 points, gaits 30 points, music and suitability 10 points, catch 10 points.

Music is provided by the exhibitor. It is recommended that the tape has only the song to be used recorded on it. No restarts will be given for incorrect setting of tapes. Please label your tape.





Stable Management Issues Number 1 - Soaking Hay

Why soak hay and how long should hay be soaked for to avoid losing all the nutrients?

Very dusty, mouldy, musty smelling hay should not be fed to miniature horses at all, not even soaked. Owners sometimes believe that you need to feed poor quality hay to eliminate too much weight gain. If the hay has gone mouldy then it has not been well made, it may not be very nutritious but more importantly the mould may have produced toxins which any amount of soaking will not remove.

However there are occasions when it is necessary to soak hay, such as when a horse is very sensitive to even low levels of dust due to allergies, for instance. If you hear your miniature coughing in his stable and he is not suffering from a cold or other related health problem then it is usually due to a reaction to dust in his hay.

The advice used to be to soak hay for 24 hours, as this would cause fungal spores to swell and rupture. The 24hrs soak was then replaced with the 2 hour soak. This is reckoned to be long enough to make the spores sufficiently waterlogged that they sink, or at least stick to the hay and cannot be inhaled. In two hours, fewer nutrients are leached out and the hay is safe.

Latest thinking now is that even this amount of soaking is not necessary. So long as the hay is all thoroughly dampened, it may not need actual soaking. If the slices of hay are shaken out and hosed carefully, or totally immersed in a tub of 'clean' water (which I personally prefer), this will dampen the spores so that they are not inhaled.

However long or not the hay was soaked, as soon as it is given to your Miniature, it will start to dry out, and more spores will develop. The benefits of soaking hay are lost when the hay is dry again. So it is no good soaking hay in the morning and leaving to dry all day for feeding it in the evening. Horses will eat wet hay, although some need time to get used to it.

My Miniatures eat wet hay quite happily but they do not like it when it has been soaking too long. I place their hay nets into large water tubs (obtainable from any DIV store) fill with fresh water. I then muck out leaving the hay soaking for no more than 5 to 10 minutes. I then drain the water away and hang the hay nets up to drip on my stable yard gate for about 15 minutes. By the time I have mucked out fetched 'my girls' in and rugged them up the hay is ready to feed. Wet enough to discourage any coughing but not so wet as to have to a wet stable floor and bed.

Finally a note of caution.

When hay has been soaking for any length of time the water becomes full of nutrients. This water becomes unsafe. It is so full of nutrients that it is a pollutant, as bad for waterways as the effluent from silage, and should not be poured down the drain. For the same reason do NOT be tempted to keep the water for use again the next day- always use fresh water. If you only use a soaking container just a little bit larger than your haynet(s) you will in fact use very little water.


