

And so to bed!

Having over the years tried various bedding materials for my horses, I have settled on the chopped hemp type. I use either Aubiose or Equisorb. Expensive I hear you ask? Well, Iet me explain my reasoning here.

I used straw for years, it certainly has its pro's:

- 1. It is very warm
- 2. It is cheap.
- 3. It is still very easy to source.

In my opinion it also has its cons:

- 1. It carries various bugs.
- 2. It is VERY dusty (unless expensively dust extracted)
- 3. A lot of horses just eat it...and eat it...and...
- 4. This is the worst thing about it IMO It allows urine and dung to cling to itself and to liberally spread themselves over our little dears.

I have used shavings. Again, there are the pros:

- 1. It is warm
- 2. Although not as cheap as straw it is not hugely expensive.
- 3. It is cleaner than straw.
- 4. It is easy to muck out

And so to the cons:

- 1. It sticks to the horses, the rugs, and me!
- 2. The dust factor (more expensive with dust extracted)
- 3. Urine soaks away into it, but still the dung gets onto the horses.
- 4. It takes a long long time to decompose, so does not make such good compost.

The chopped hemp I have used for the past year or so, pros:

- 1. It is clean and some types have an insecticide added to discourage eating. (I find that the horses try to eat it the first day or so then don't bother)
- 2. It does not stick to either me the horse or the rugs (Yippee)
- 3. The urine soaks into a sort of ball underneath the top layer and can be skipped out very easily (sort of like cat litter!)
- 4. The dung gets covered in the stuff and does not allow much to get onto the horses.
- 5. It breaks down really quickly and makes wonderful, very sellable compost.
- 6. Although relatively expensive it lasts really well, I put a bed down new, and only have to top up every six or seven days, and then it does not take much...skipping out regularly is the key.

Cons:

- 1. You do have to skip out regularly...
- 2. No more cons for me ©

So there you have my thoughts on bedding....what does everyone else do, I am always interested in learning tips and using good ideas from others?

Flu Vaccination Reaction in the Miniature Horse A personal view By Jane Davenport - Lister

Seven Years ago I made the decision to stop vaccinating my horses for Equine Influenza. This was a result of six months of hell after my entire herd of 50 miniatures contracted flu like symptoms after vaccination. A group of weanlings were vaccinated together & soon became ill one by one. Even though the horses were isolated the symptoms of depression , high temperature , coughing & runny nose spread slowly through almost all my horses. ALL WERE FULLY VACCINATED. It took six months of hard work & a lot of expense to finally hear the last cough. I talked it through with my vet & we decided enough was enough. My vet contacted the vaccine companies who insisted a miniature should receive the full dose of vaccine. Once I made it known I had got a problem MANY miniature owners phoned complaining of similar problems. One large breeder commented on the death of several miniatures after vaccination & another phoned in desperation as the red blood cells in her two miniature were being destroyed.

Exhibitor often ask why I don't show at HOYS, I don't as vaccination is compulsory. This year at HOYS three exhibitors told me of their problems this year alone with vaccinating their show horses, of missed shows & wasted entry fees & horses just "not right".

Previous to our "big" problem we would ,at some part of the year, get a cough or runny nose on the yard. Since I have stopped vaccinating this is no longer a constant worry. I do take precautions with my show horses, They are stabled & turned out away from my breeding stock. We use homeopathic & herbal remedies to try to protect our horses & for me it seems the best option.

What I would like to do is to collate some information & try to find out if there really is a problem with miniature horses & IF there is to present the findings to the vaccine companies.

I have therefore contact most societies for help. I NEED to know if you have had a problem or if indeed you have been vaccinating miniatures for years & never had a problem. I do believe it is only certain horses that get a reaction & don't wish to panic anyone with this research. The following information would be helpful & please feel free to let me know your experiences in fullest detail. You can remain anonymous if you like!

I have heard of serious problems with vaccination of dogs & understand that it is possible to use a smaller dose of vaccine with tiny dogs, any information about this may help?






