Horse Training: It's all in the attitude! Written by Jennifer Groters from Alvadar Ranch, USA

Why is it that two people who do the same jobs can have such different perspectives about them? While one can't wait to go to work, the other has a difficult time wanting to get out of bed, dreading the day, because he dislikes his job. It doesn't take a rocket scientist to know that there is one basic thing that separates these two people. It is a positive attitude. One focuses on the pleasure he derives from his day, while the other focuses on the negative in his day.

I don't know of a single solitary soul who wants to go to a job that he hates doing. The attitude that a horse and his trainer have each day is exactly the point of this article. Many people think that training is the actual mechanics of the day: how much food? how long in the round pen? How much and how long only go so far. What training is really all about is a great attitude. The very best show horses in the world, regardless of their breed, love what they do. The person who said that " horses are people too", wasn't too far off. Horses don't want to do a job they find no pleasure in anymore than does a person. My Grandfather used to say that 90 percent of what was wrong with a horse was plainly and simply human error. So where do we go from here? I guess the best place to start is simply where I start. By the end of every show season, I've just about used up my reserves. When I finish Nationals/Worlds it's time for me and my horse associates to take a break and for a couple of months we just hang out. Then along about January we start to put it all together again for the next season. Horses are evaluated for show potential and basic exercise programs are started. But for me it doesn't really begin until I take my yearly trip to San Diego, California. "Why there", you ask? First let me explain that I live in Michigan where the word "winter" was invented. In late January my attitude stinks, so I fly to see my dear friend Joel D. White, horse trainer extraordinaire, for a good attitude adjustment. (The fact that he happens to live where it's always warm doesn't hurt anything either.) He's one of those really nice guys with more talent than he realizes, and for a few days he reminds me of the things I really enjoy about horses. His basic philosophy goes something like this: "If you're not having fun then your horse isn't having fun and you won't achieve a great end result. I can't stress enough how much better results you'll get if you can make it fun." I asked Joel if he would in his own words tell us about a day of basic training, and how attitude, both his and the horse's, plays a role in the final result. This is what he said; (I need to add here that Joel's day begins with several cups of coffee - his positive attitude adjustment for the day). I start my day in the barn with feeding in the AM. I do my own feeding so that I can monitor the weight of each horse. This is why it is also important for me to work my own horses during the week. I need to see their weight and also their conditioning. I can usually vary a horses feed regularly according to the amount of work they had that day as well as how their muscle tone is coming along. Similar to people, horses are individuals, and the way they eat and apply their food needs to be somewhat tailored to each of them... I need to know how to feed them! Feeds need to be balance for a horse's age, as well as for the stage of conditioning that he is in. For instance, I will work a horse up to a higher protein diet for the first 30 to 60 days. As they condition, I will lower the protein in their diet. I feed alfalfa pellets, but I need to be aware of the mineral content as well and then feed certain grains in order to compensate. I am not a nutrition specialist (but with the advise of vets and peers, I have found what works for me). I also try to make sure that the horses get enough water. Moisture in their feed is important to me. I feed wet beet pulp with their feed and I water my horses with buckets or tubs so that I can monitor their drinking. These things that I have mentioned are considered every morning when I am feeding. I need my horses to be happy and comfortable in order for them to learn.

The most important tool for me to have as a trainer is my attitude toward them. The hardest part of learning to be a trainer is learning your own sense of timing and knowing what you want from your horse. When you understand these things, training becomes very easy to you because it comes naturally to you, and you respond quickly and appropriately when you need too. I have been very lucky to have been associated with top rate horsemen through the years and involved in different breeds during many eras. There are several quotes from these "mentors" which are imbedded in my mind and surface regularly. Jim Boyce, my farrier for 30 years, always said to me, "Why don't you just be positive?" Rob Tanner, Saddlebred trainer extraordinaire, says, "First, before anything else is your horse comfortable? And "The best show horse shows himself." Johnny Johnston, horse photographer, explains to others and me before every photo shoot that horses are 80 percent visual, 15 percent hearing, and 5 percent physical. They all agree with the fact that timing is "everything" on yours and the horse's part. Attitude is so important that it is 80 percent of training. IFYOUR HORSE HAS A VERY PHYSICAL JOB, CONSIDER HOW MUCH ATTITUDE THIS TAKES! It's all related! Only in the last eight to ten years has most of this finally come together for me. Before that time I was still trying to put it together. It's an incredible feeling to "know" that you are getting as much as possible from a horse exactly when you need it in the show ring. I have become an adrenalin junky in the show ring. At the barn, I try to maintain a classroom type setting.

Each horse is first tied and groomed. Then I go through and work them. This way, I'm in and out of each horse's stall at least 3 times per day. I do a lot of the training for my halter horses during the time it takes me to get form the stall to the round pen. In this way I discipline myself so that I don't "overkill" with their attitude.

Horses have a short attention span, so I ask for small amounts when I think they are in the right frame of mind. Since I believe that horses are happy animals naturally, these opportunities present themselves constantly. They have to be physically capable to do what I want and emotionally available in order to learn. For instance, I try to be fair by not asking for too much right after exercising. After they are cooled out and groomed again, I blanket and wrap them up. They are always fed within an hour of the same time everyday to minimize anxiety about their breakfast and dinner.

Horses learn through routine and repetition: this involves timing once again. Feeding each day at the same time, and working and asking the same thing without major variation, is all related to timing and attitude.

Now that you have all been privy to the reason I travel to San Diego every year I'll tell you just exactly what I take home.

If you have a good individualized feed program for each horse it will show up in a happy healthy horse.

If you have a good individualized exercise program for each horse it will show up in a physically capable horse.

If you treat your horse with respect and help to build his self-esteem he will trust you when you most need him too.

If you ask small amounts from your horse daily he will build on that learning and eventually give you a whole bunch when you request it from him in the show ring.

It all boils down to one major thing: "YOU GET FROM YOUR HORSE EXACTLY WHAT YOU PUT INTO HIM."


SHOW REPORT



One of the main points of interest was driving and how to get started in training your miniature horse. One of our member's Lindy How was given some individual tuition with her newly broken horse 'Paint'. Lindy gained a lot of confidence and said she thoroughly enjoyed the session. Bill told us all what he is looking for when judging the driving classes and gave some helpful hints and advice. Other member's also brought along their horses for some one to one training session's which they were pleased with the results. The day was rounded off with something to eat and having a bit of a chat with friends which is not always possible between the classes on busy show days. Many thanks to Jill for hosting the clinic and allowing us the free use of her facilities at New Close Farm.

ASK THE PANEL

This issue we have had a lot of member's ask about the scurfy patches our horses sometimes get from time to time, especially on the face. This can be attributable to a lot of reasons and the first thing is to consider whether your horse is receiving a balanced diet with sufficient oil. It may be helpful to add a little oil to the feed, plain old vegetable oil will do although there are a lot of different types available if you look on the shelf in your local feed merchants. We can not go into all the various feeds and supplements that are available for there are far too many and we would not advocate any one brand over another. Besides which if you think your horses diet needs looking at the best person to advise you is your vet. Helpful advice can usually be obtained from your feed merchants but your vet is the expert. Don't forget horses can be overfed as well as under fed and I don't just mean in quantity, you can overdo the supplements and keep a watchful eye on the protein level in the grain. A blood test taken by your vet will show if your horse is being fed too much protein.

If you are satisfied there is nothing wrong with the diet it may be as a result of clipping. Especially if you notice the patches and bumps get worse after you have just clipped. If that is the case try a dettol bath straight after clipping. Mix dettol with warm water as warm as you can comfortable bear in fact and wipe the horse down completely after you have clipped. You can use either cotton wool or a cloth but make sure you thoroughly wipe the horse. Hopefully that will do the trick.

Good grooming also helps to remove the dirt and dust and stimulate the circulation, it helps the skin regenerate faster by removing the dead skin cells on the surface. Some horses do have allergies which may be the cause, it really is a process of trial and error. If you have a lot of bird droppings in your stables clean them up as they release spores which can affect sensitive horses. Do let us know if you have any success with this or if you think you might have the answer.

The Draft Debate.

Much debate is conducted at MHCGB meetings and around the ringside at shows on the 'draft horse type'. Therefore, we are opening up this topic for discussion, we are inviting members to put pen to paper or fingers to keyboards and have your say.....

What is a draft type miniature horse?? Well firstly let us look at the word draft, this brings to mind a working horse, a horse working in a field perhaps pulling a plough, or a dray in days gone by, so are we thinking a Shire/Clydesdale horse? But now picture a quality Irish draft horse! Let us look at the last two words 'Miniature Horse' Horse – not pony.

I consider a draft type is not a refined horse which lacks quality, nor an overweight refined horse with minimal bone to carry his structure. The draft horse must have bone but also length of leg in comparison to the body. He must be a quality individual with good proportion, a good neck set with a thicker and more pronounced crest than a refined horse. A more rounded individual with substance. I could list here many ideals I would look for in a draft type but would my words bring a similar picture into everyone's head – probably not.

The MHCGB rules ask for judges to penalise pony type characteristics in their judging. This does bring problems for judges when faced with a draft class.

So how do we rectify the problem and instruct judges on the type definition of a 'draft' type Miniature Horse.

Do we let the show ring dictate the desired type? or do we as breeders and exhibitors drive forward the ideals of the Miniature Horse industry, we ask judges to give credibility to our breeding standards, but we must give judges an idea of what we want to achieve. They must have a picture in their minds.

When judging myself I can picture many miniature horses as my ideal, I hold these images in my mind and look for the closest resemblance to this ideal. Remember type is number one on our list of judging priorities. Good conformation is good conformation the horse world over. Many judges, although excellent horse judges, have viewed very few miniature horses compared to you and I. Hence at our major shows we employ the services of a top US Miniature World judge to assess our breeding goals.

Judges from the UK if asked to judge say a lightweight, middleweight or heavyweight hunter, a small or large hack or a small or large riding horse will have a stored image in their minds of many past champions, assessing the type before them will be relatively easy. You hear at the ringside all day long 'That horse is true to type' All of these breed types are well established, remember Miniature Horse showing is in its infancy. Also remember how the breed quality has progressed even in the last few years.

I believe the way forward is to give judges an 'ideal of type' a picture for their minds.

No point standing at the ringside moaning, or ask a judge to explain why your horse didn't win or worse still stand in the ring and tell the judge what you thought should have won the class! Remember a judge has to place all horses starting at 1st place, if he doesn't see a good draft type in his class he cannot dismiss the class with no placings!

Let us drive our breed forward in a positive way. Help us educate our judges. If you have a photo or can produce a drawing of your ideal 'Draft type' please send it to the club address or email to mhcgb2@aol.com
