


Performance Champion was the versatile 'Royal Oakes Mystical Silver Moon' handled by Sally Hunter.

#### SPIT 'n POLISH

(or the taking of a small hairy person to a state of show readiness!!)

Ok! Its 4.30 in the morning, you are up, have fed the horses, now you are back in the kitchen having a quick cup of tea before loading the horses into box or trailer and driving off to a show. A familiar picture for most of us (mad) people who get our kicks from horse showing.

However, this is the end result in a way. For the horse to get to the stage of being loaded onto that box in preparation to going to a show, there has been months of work before hand. Lets take a look at the key stages we should be going through to get our horse to that show.

First and foremost we should have decided that our little treasure is a show prospect. He should meet with the requirements of the breed standard. It is no use in the world taking the time to prepare and train a horse for the ring, if he is so cowhocked or pin toed that he can barely move. So, look objectively at your horse, all of them will have a fault or two, there are no perfect specimens (if there were, we could all give up trying to breed one!) Know your horses faults, and you can go quite some way to rectifying it or training it out.

Feeding. Probably one of the most important aspects of show preparation is the feeding of each individual. There are many good all in one feeds on the market, and I am not going to promote any particular one of these, mainly as I don't use them, so am not conversant with the different brands. I am a great fan of soaked beet pulp, preferably the speedi beet type which does not have any molasses or other sweeteners added. I also feed straights, in the form of micronised barley. I add to this a type of "lite" chop. The beet is a good feed that releases energy slowly through the gut, and barley when fed in the correct amounts gives energy without heating the horse. I use soya oil every morning, this is good for shiny coats, and also helps the food through the gut. Garlic powder or granules is given every morning, for the immune system, and all sorts of other good things, resistance to worms, and biting insects being just a couple. I have recently started using a food supplement called Top Spec, I have been using it for about four months now, and I am pleased with the results, I am getting firmer toplines and a tighter muscle mass. You will need to work out the amount of feed your horse needs in conjunction with the amount of work he is given. I feed all horses that are stabled twice a day, morning and evening, and they have hay three or four times during the day. If you are working your horse in the morning, let him digest his feed for half an hour or so before work. Feeding is such a big topic that it needs an article on its own, but use common sense, don't under or overfeed your horse, and remember that horses being grazing animals should be trickle feeding through out the day, so feed the hay little and often if you can.

Training. For MHCGB we show US style, which means that our horses will be expected to stand in a show pose for quite some time. They should stand quietly and not be fussing and stamping around, you never know when the judge will be looking at you, so it is worthwhile to have your horse trained to stand still. I do "stand" training every day, even with horses that know the job.

It is worthwhile training with his show halter on, if you only train at home with an ordinary halter, it can come as a nasty surprise to your horse to find himself with a show halter and chain on. Stand in front of your horse, hold one hand up with fingers wide and say in a firm voice "stand". Start with just a few seconds, praise the horse, walk off and then bring him back into a stand. Once you have asked for the stand do not let him get away with even moving a foot, back him up and ask for the stand again. He will get it soon enough with patience and firmness on your part. He will need to walk calmly with you at his shoulder, do not allow him to heave you around the ring whilst he screams insults or leers at the nearest filly. He should trot out smartly and with "presence" and then come back to a nice and balanced stand, which he may have to keep up for up to twenty minutes or so depending on the size of the class. If it is a big class, you can move him in a small circle and bring him back into a stand as the judge is looking at the others. He will also need to be good while you show the judge his teeth. I stand at his shoulder, putting my right hand across his neck and open top and bottom lip with my thumb and fingers. This is a quick and efficient way to do it and the horse soon learns to have this done without head tossing or struggling.

I work my horses for about 20 minutes a day on the lunge or free circling. Start gradually, building up to about ten minutes on either rein, in trot and canter. Walking is good, about an hour every other day, up and down hills if you can...builds muscle that you can see. Your horse should be going into that show ring with a healthy body and mind, exercise is an important factor in both these departments.

Coat conditioning: Our little darlings can come out of the winter looking like hairy yaks. Some people hold off body clipping for a few weeks, as the horse will sweat and lose weight more quickly when worked with a full coat. If you are going to do this, remember to get your horse thoroughly dry, standing in a cold stable with a soaking sweaty coat is not such a good idea. I clip right from the start, I like tidy horses! If they are straight off the field, I clip them with a 2 or 3ml blade, then bath them. They are then rugged up cosy and warm, with hoods and if necessary tail bags. A grooming routine is essential if you are going to get your horses coat into its best condition. It does not have to take long, in fact I think I spend less than ten minutes a day on the all over grooming. I start with a rubber tool that has (for want of a better word) lumps all over it, and massage the whole body, this stimulates blood flow and is really good for the hair follicles. Then a good few minutes with the body brush, ending by combing mane and tail. I only use plastic combs, I find the metal sort break the hair too easily. I spray a good quality conditioner over the coat every few days and use Cowboy Magic for the tail and mane.

So we have a show coming up in a couple of weeks. By now we should have a horse that is fit and healthy. He knows his job in regard to the conformation side of showing. (Performance is a whole other ball game, not covered here)

About a week and a half before the show I clip the horse, depending on the type of coat, I will use a 1.5 or 2ml blade on the body. This gives time for some coat colour to come back, especially if you have a darker coloured horse. About a couple of days before the show I clip head and ears, I use a 1ml blade "with" the direction of hair growth all over his head. From his muzzle up to about the tear bone, I use a 0.6ml blade against the hair growth. This gives a very neat and smart appearance. Make sure you clip neatly around the nostrils, it is an area that has hair growing in different directions and can look messy if not done well. You can also clip an area over the eye of the horse with the shorter blade, to highlight this area.

A good bath the day before the show, using a shampoo for the type and colour of the horses coat. Make sure you dry him off well before rugging him up again. I stand mine under heat lamps with a couple of towels over them until dry. Cowboy Magic combed though his mane and tail while still wet makes it wonderfully shiny and manageable. Put his hood on and rug him up. I wrap the legs, (especially the white ones!) and bandage the tail, ending with a tail bag.

You now have a horse that is ready for the journey to the show tomorrow. Do not forget all the things you need to take with you, grooming equipment for him, including hoof paint and rubber gloves to put this on with. Feed, buckets etc. Show halters, and any rugs you need for him. Your own show clothes, show cane, hat. Put these things in the lorry the night before, you will not want to be rushing around at some ridiculous time in the morning wondering where on earth you left your boots or whatever.


Now, go to bed......and don't forget to put the alarm on!! Happy showing.


