






Sational Spring And AMHA Show



A change of venue for this vears National Spring and UK AMHA show to the prestigious Arena UK Grantham proved a huge hit with both members new and old to kick off the 2007 show season. Record breaking entries, and lots of new faces, meant over 100 horses were entered into the 58 classes on offer. The quality of horses in every class was high. AMHA approved Judge from the US Leslie Connor commented she was impressed by the quality and production of horses before her.

Members travelled from as far as the New forest and Scotland to compete making this a truly National

Starting off the day, Kelly Wilson was the winner in the Newcomer class with Little Americas Tex Triumphant. Kelly having travelled all the way from Scotland, received the £250 New Close Farm voucher.

Refined classes drew huge quality entries. The eventual section Champion and Reserve coming from the two biggest classes, each with 13 horses forward, were NCF Lunars Koh I Nor & NCF Mister Magic Man for Jill Robinson.

Quality and true to type entries were forward for the hotly contested draft section. Section Champion was the impressive Looking Glass Baby Rocco for Simon Hall, looking better than ever this season with a new recruit for Gill Jones Ujenik Little Emma Reserve ably shown throughout the day by junior member Lucy Larson Bown.

Falabella section was once again won by the consistent Baby Rocco who really is making this title his own with Looking Glass Mezmerise from the same stable following in reserve.

Part Falabella section was won by Looking Glass Simply Magic for Janice Goudie, the reserve was NCF Little Sweetheart for Laura Bias.

The well filled AMHA section was won by NCF Lunars Koh I Nor with the Pallats correct little stallion Lucky Fours Classy Dude Reserve coming from a strong senior stallion class.

Part AMHA classes were particularly well supported with MHCGB 2006 Part bred horse of the Year NCF Mister Magic Man taking champion with Ujenik Extasys Expresso taking Reserve for Louise Armitage.

British Bred winner was Ujenik Little Emma with Asils Artic Sunstorm for Essex based Sue Bradshaw.

Forty starters in the Scaled down show horse section provided worthy Champions of NCF Berrys Love Potion for new member Yvonne McMath from the Hack class and Reserve from the Hunter class Asils Pretty Boy Floyd for a delighted Pat Englund from Boston.

The palomino stallion Lucky Four Skippa Velvet Gold, in magnificent coat, for new member Dawn Jones shown by Michelle Pallatt headed the line up in the Colour Championship with Reserve being taken by the well marked and aptly named Asils Spot On for Sue Bradshaw, from 58 starters.

Cash prizes were handed out to the top six horses placed in MHCGB gelding incentive class. Consistent gelding award winner was NCF Mystical Golden Moon for a delighted Marion Lovelace heading the class also winning the Novice driving from a field of young promising horses.

A top class line up featured in the new futurity nominated class with the winner the pinto NCF Lunars

Performance classes where dominated by junior member Emma Armitage with her new and beautifully behaved gelding La Vista Really Remarkable. This pair look like becoming an unbeatable performance partnership.

New members Jackie King with HighgateHead Morning Surprise, Margaret Hillyer with Looking glass Little Africa, Shirley Charlton with NCF Lunar Lightning and M Moore with Golden Oak Silver Tinsel, a superb example of a correct & typey draft horse; got off to a good start showing with MHCGB scoring wins to be proud of in their classes.

The Supreme Championship with the two judges judging independently was decided on a points system each judge placing horses forward. US judge placed Jill Robinsons NCF Koh I Nor as Supreme & Reserve champion NCF Mister Magic Man. The UK judge choosing as Supreme the impressive and consistent winning stallion Looking Glass Baby Rocco and NCF Koh I Nor as reserve.

The counting of the points gave Jill Robinsons outstanding yearling filly NCF Lunars Koh I Nor by FLF Stars Lunar Eclipse and out of Scott Creek Monarch Mocha her first Supreme Championship. Reserve supreme going to a surprised and delighted Gill Jones with Ujenik Little Emma (placed 4th by both judges).



Member in the Spot Light

How did I get into miniatures?

I went to visit long standing friends, Philip & Sandra Matthews-Brown of Washbanks Miniature Horse Stud who live in a neighbouring village. They had just rescued a lovely miniature black and white pinto mare her two-year-old filly, her three-year-old colt and her yearling colt. All the mares foals were by the same stallion and although well bred had been quite neglected and had been handled very badly. When I saw them the colts were in a barn and very very frightened. They really looked a bit moth eaten!

Philip was going to keep the mare & filly but was looking for good homes for the colts, I really liked the dark one who was a black dun, but I did not think I could ever manage to handle him as at that time he was quite wild and would kick violently and mean it. The three year old a coloured colt was a bit quieter and quickly found a good home, and is now a licensed stallion standing in France.

Philip was handling the colts all the time and they quickly began to come around Shortly afterwards one of Philip's Connemara mares inexplicably rejected her colt foal. Unfortunately, none of the mares wanted to act as companion so Philip as a last resort put the yearling colt by this time named Teddy Boy in with two-day-old Connemara foal. They instantly became the best of friends and were constant companions for the next four months.


I started helping to get them in from the field

and fell in love with
Teddy. When he finished his foal minding
I asked Philip if he
thought I might be able
to cope with him, as by
this time he was very

quiet indeed. I did intend to have him gelded and keeping him as a pet. He came to live with us in Oct 2004 and my husband converted the 12x12 stable into two compartments.

We got through the spring and the Miniature Horse bug had really bitten. I had an idea that I would love to have a foal and keep Teddy entire so I had him licensed and the vet was very impressed by Teddy's soundness and conformation which gave me great encouragement.

As such I started looking for a young mare. I fell for Asils Velvet Touch and she arrived in Jul 2005. In Oct 05 I got a second mare Looking Glass Crown Jewel, a lovely purebred Falabella, a rich chestnut with flaxen tail and mane. More stables were created and the tack room was duly converted into a stable. The tack moved into rug room.



many discussions I decided (with Philip's encouragement) to try showing Teddy. Philip clipped him out and off we went to our first show at Boston on 4/6/06, then Crowlands at the end of June and so on. Teddy can be quite a hand full for me to manage, so by the end of July I had got my husband signed up as a member and he started showing Teddy in some classes. On



Sept 23rd we went to UK Arena and Teddy entered the Elite class and was Judged Elite Grading Draught type.





We have had some excellent showing results and have won and been placed at many shows.

In Oct 06 I bought two filly foals Meadow Fox Mosaic, a leopard spot & Asils Sunshadow, a bay

spot bred who is now spotting out. I have started showing them in 2007 and of course another 12x12 stable was converted to accommodate the minis. Still a number of stables left to convert. Also just before Christmas Philip bought a Mare, Stallion & their 6 month old colt from the owner who had lost some grazing. Then another empty stable has been converted into two as I bought the colt foal called Elvestouch Little Merlyn. Merlyn's father is Asils Pretty Boy Floyd who Pat Englund is showing this season with great success. Of course an empty stable



never seems to be empty long and I have bought another mare from Phillip who I had wanted for a couple of years.

This year also saw the arrival of our first foal

at the Southash Stud. A Palomino colt by Teddy Boy out of Asils Velvet Touch. We are very proud of him but will part with him this year to a

loving showing home as we have too many boys.

Breeding Miniature Spotted Horses

Breeding Miniature Horses is quite a difficult objective in its own right, in order to obtain quality, refinement, good conformation, correct size, good temperament and soundness. The demands in the market for refined horses and increased standards of excellence sought by Miniature Horse enthusiasts continues to rise. When your objective in addition to the above is also to breed sought after spotted coat patterns, the exercise becomes very difficult indeed for the stud owner.

I have spoken to a number of long established miniature spotted horse and pony breeders in an effort to try to put forward their experiences as to how to maximise your success in breeding spotted animals.

Without doubt one of the most difficult things it appears is to predict what type of spotted coat pattern or indeed if spots will appear at all in the animals that we breed. The difficulty experienced in breeding a good loudly spotted miniature horse clearly indicates why they are quickly sold and good ones demand high prices. There always seems to be potential buyers and a couple of studs spoken to have a waiting list of patient customers.

There are a number of coat patterns associated with spotteds and a brief description of the main ones are as follows:

Leopard SpotThis animal would be spotted all over, with large or small spots. Any colour spots are permitted on a white or pale coloured background.



Near Leopard......This is similar to the Leopard but most often has a darker head, neck and legs.

Snowflake......This colouring is where you have a number of white spots distributed over the body on a dark base colour.

Blanket Spot......This is where the horse has an area of white over the hindquarters on a darker base colour. It is interesting that the white area need not contain spots and the white area can be extensive including shoulder, back and hips.

Mottled or varnish.....This colouration can vary from a roan that has dark marks appearing in the coat, to an animal that has small irregular ticks of white. The markings often have quite blurred edges hence the term, varnished markings.

Few Spot.......This shows a white base colour with only one or two spots appearing. Often a few spot will have even quite strong varnish markings perhaps over part of the head, the stifle and extending perhaps down the gaskins. On the front legs the knees and front of the cannon bones may also show dark varnish marks. It is very important to note that a true few spot is always born such and should not be confused with an animal that may have been quite spotted as a youngster but has then lost its spots. The latter would be carrying the fading gene and should be avoided in the spotted breeding program.

Solid Colour......Yes this is as the name suggests, an animal that has no visible spotted characteristics but has been bred from proven spotted parents. It can then be registered in the spotted breed society and can be a valuable addition in the



breeding of spotted ponies.

All horses carrying the spotted gene will show certain characteristics other than

coat pattern colouration. They must all show some or all of the following characteristics such as stripped hooves where the hoof has narrow white vertical lines on the hoof. However, if this is accompanied with a white sock the whole hoof may be white. They should show a white sclera of the eye, which will be present at birth. Also they should show mottled skin pigmentation, which is usually present on the muzzle, face and genitalia to a greater or lesser degree. It is quite interesting that mottled skin is present in only about a third of foals when born and is acquired later.

Producing an animal with good spotted markings always has a degree of luck about it. Genetically a spotted animal is never homozygous unless it is a genuine Few Spot. All other spotted ponies are heterozygous in their genetic makeup, which means simplistically that they all carry a solid colour gene as well as a spotted colour gene. As such two beautifully marked leopard spotted



animals
could be
mated together and
produce a
solid coloured animal
with no
spots at all.

It seems evident that not too much is actually known about the genetic makeup of the spotted. There is clearly a spotted gene but this must be influenced by a number of modifying genes if you like so that it can produce the variation of coat patterns that are evident. It is clear from all breeders spoken to that they have produced huge variations of colouring in offspring from the same parents

It seems that breeding from stock that is well marked

year after year.

and has known well marked parents, grandparents and great grand parents etc. has enabled some breeders to be successful in producing a lot of colour in the animals that they breed. Others spoken to have had much success breeding from solid coloured spot bred mares put to a spotted stallion. Truly, the most successful way of breeding spotted horses is to use a few spot. As mentioned earlier a true few spot because of its genetic makeup will almost certainly produce a spotted coat pattern. .However, there would be no guarantee that it would be loudly marked, by this I mean large well defined spots all over, it could indeed have only minimal spotted characteristics. Very simplistically, if a breeder uses a well marked spotted stallion on a well marked mare they could produce a solid colour. The chance of breeding a spotted coat pattern in their offspring is 50% (two in four), the chance of breeding a few spot is 25% (one in four) and the chance of breeding a solid colour is also 25% (one in four). Please remember that it is like the lottery as each time the mating occurs the same odds apply so from four matings you could produce four solid coloured offspring.

I attach some photographs of four Miniature horses bred by Anita Chaney of the Asils Stud who has been breeding Miniature Spotted horses for the past 15 years. The photographs are all bred from the same parents just to emphasis the variation that can occur. A photograph of the sire can is also shown separately. Spotted ponies and horses can also have another characteristic of sparse mane and tail. Often known as a finger mane and a rat-tail. The mane can have such little hair that it would not be possible to even plait and the tail can have only minimal hair at the end. Personally, I dislike this characteristic often seen in the American Appaloosa and along with many of the breeders spoken too prefer the full mane and tail. The studs did emphasis that they do not use stock with this characteristic as it is very difficult to eradicate it, and could well crop up in generations to come.

solid coloured animal with no Modern breeders of miniature horses are striving to breed well proportioned stock with small heads and long necks. This can be quite a challenge when using many



British bred spotted ponies as the ponies have often carried very heavy heads and have been stocky in build. Combining, American, Dutch and Fallabella lines have created some very nice animals. Indeed the mare pictured is full American breeding tracing back to the famous Chianti and Legendary Freckles who in turn were Falabellas. The stallion combines English and Dutch breeding.

In short I along with many others love the spotted coat patterns. However, until I actually looked into it more closely I was unaware how difficult it actually is to breed the sort of animal that we all would love, the loudly marked spotted. As such if you set your mind on acquiring such an animal then I suggest that you contact well established breeders to let them know what you seek because from experience I know that such animals often don't need to be advertised.



In Sickness and in health



General Signs Of Health And Ailments

We as horse owners owe it to our horses to care for them to the best of our abilities. They rely on us to do that and as they cannot tell us what the problem is. We can only work it out by knowing what is normal for each individual horse.

We all know how much a visit from the vet can be and tend to try and avoid calling them out, but would you be able to identify the symptoms if the horse was in urgent need of veterinary treatment, whereby the sooner the vet treats the horse the better. It could be the case that early treatment may require less treatment therefore reducing the cost or even save the horses life.

Here are some <u>guidelines</u> differentiating between a health horse, a horse slightly of colour or an ill horse requiring veterinary attention.

Healthy Horse:

- * Flat Shiny coat
- * Alert and bright eyes
- * Eating and drinking normal amounts
- * Droppings—normal quantity and consistency 8-10 sets per day (depending on diet)
- * Passing a normal quantity of water and without an alteration in colour
- * Membrane of eye should be salmon pink
- * Breathing normally i.e. 8-12 inhalations per minute for a full size horse and 10 18 for Miniatures at rest
- *Temperature between 99F-101F or 37.2C-38.3C (can be affected by climate)
- * Heart rate 34-44 B.P.M at rest

Off Colour Horse

- * May have loss of appetite
- * May appear more quiet than usual or showing less interest
- * There could be an alteration in droppings i.e. more loose than normal or firmer and less of them
- * Could have a dull staring coat
- * Slight alteration in temperature and/or respiration

One or more of these symptoms should give you enough cause for concern for closer supervision

Seriously Ill Horse


- * Refusing to eat or drink
- * Sweating and shivering
- * Heavy Breathing
- * Significant rise or fall in temperature
- * Lack of droppings or very loose droppings
- * Showing Signs of colic
- * Getting up and down and trying to roll
- * Alteration in colour of the membrane of the eye:- <u>RED</u> can imply temperature or pain. <u>BLUE</u> could be heart or circulation problems. <u>YELLOW</u> can signify worms or a liver problem.

Any of these symptoms would warrant a visit from your vet, or an injury causing profuse bleeding in need of stitching. Another reason for the vet would be if your horse is very lame. The slightest lameness will show in trot, whereas if the horse is lame in walk it is usually more serious.

Of course each horse is different so it is a good idea to get to know what is the "norm" for your horse.

In the next Newsletter I will explain how to take the Temperature, Pulse and Respiration, and talk more about colic.


