All three events must be completed at a show for that show's placings to count.

In classes where whole class placings and Jnr placings are awarded to the junior competitors, only placings against the whole class are used for Trio points.

A 1st place will gain 10points, 2nd 8points, 3rd 6points, 4th 4points, 5th 2points and 6th 1point.

If you take part in the Trio qualifying classes at a show but are unplaced in any of them, you will still enter on the leader board but will gain 0points for that particular class.

A maximum of three shows from across the year will give the final totals. If you only compete at one or two shows and fulfil the rest of the criteria, you will still gain points on the leader board.

You must take part in these three disciplines at the Grand Champs Show on the 28th Aug 2021 to be eligible for the title.

It needs to be the same horse / handler combination for the whole season. You can compete multiple animals if you wish.

You will need to compete in either the novice or the open section for the whole season.

If four or more Junior (16yrs or under) competitors compete at a minimum of three shows - one of which MUST be the Grand Championships Show in August - then we will add an extra award to the highest place Junior Trio competitor.

Dressage specific information: Novice will be split into an in-hand class and a long-reined class - both will do the same test. These will be judged and placed as individual classes however, when it comes to allocating points to the Performance Trio leaderboard, the scores from the classes will be amalgamated, and Trio points awarded based on the percentage scores ranked from highest to lowest across the two classes. Competitors will only be allowed to enter EITHER the Novice In-hand OR the Novice Long-reined dressage at each show.
